Dear Parent / Carer,

I hope that this newsletter finds you all safe and well and that you are continuing to find your way as a family in these difficult times. The staff and I have really enjoyed seeing and hearing about the wonderful and varied things you have been doing to keep busy while at home. We have had a good response to our online learning and if you have not accessed it yet or need some further guidance you will find more information contained in this newsletter.

The teaching staff have been trying to find other ways to support and connect with the children and we have started our own youtube channel! The staff have been reading stories, doing exercise and sharing key learning so please take time to visit the channel as I am sure the children will love to see the teachers and hear some great stories. Even though our school is currently closed to all but a few children, we are still here to support your child and your family in whatever way we can. As we are all living so differently you might be noticing signs of increasing anxiety in your child as they're spending more time indoors and outside of their normal routines. These might include:

- Regressing to outgrown behaviour, such as thumb-sucking or bed-wetting ٠
- Showing greater fear at being separated from you ٠
- **Tantrums** ٠
- **Trouble sleeping** ٠
- Expressing sadness, anger or fear ٠
- Wanting to talk about coronavirus all the time
- Not wanting to talk about the current situation at all 4
- ٠ Having trouble concentrating

We have put together some resources to help you support your child (sent with this newsletter) but if you have any concerns about how your child is coping or you need any other support from the school, please let us know by using the contact details that we have outlined on the left.

We are extremely grateful for all the support you have shown us as we have adapted to these new circumstances and we are very proud of the children who are coping so well with the changes and challenges they are facing.

As a school we are missing everyone and we look forward to the time when we can see each other again. Unfortunately, at this moment in time, there is no clear indication of when that will be or what that will look like but we will keep you informed and updated as soon as we have that information.




Lots of you have been learning the new sound 'ar ar shark in the park'.



Wonderful joining of materials and what great ways to decorate them well done girls.










The imaginative and creative ways you have made Hansel and Gretel's house have really impressed us and the work has inspired you to do some wonderful writing.

Some of the activities the Year 2 teachers have set have been all about Brazil! We have been so impressed with your enthusiastic approach to this work and you have shown just how creative you can be.




We had lots of wonderful examples of amazing artwork. It was fantastic to see the use of different tones and media used to create pictures of birds native to Brazil.




We were amazed at the amount of time spent researching facts about Brazil and even more amazed at the variety of ways you presented the information. Fantastic work!

For those parents who are eligible to receive FSM, we will be using the Department for Education's preferred scheme—EDENRED. Please bear with this system as they are dealing with a huge level of demand and this has resulted in a slight delay in processing codes.

If you are in receipt of benefits and/ or are experiencing difficulties please email the school office for an application form.

Your child may be able to get free school meals if you get any of the following:

- Income Support
- income-based Jobseeker's Allowance
- income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- the guaranteed element of Pension Credit
- Child Tax Credit (provided you're not also entitled to Working Tax Credit and have an annual gross income of no more than £16,190)



- Working Tax Credit run-on paid for 4 weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit
- Universal Credit if you apply on or after 1 April 2018 your household income must be less than £7,400 a year (after tax and not including any benefits you get)

## Home Learning through Seesaw



We have begun posting online learning activities through Seesaw. This platform can be accessed through an app for mobile phones and tablets ( seesaw class) or on the desktop site (web.seesaw.me). You will need the unique code that we sent out to you via studybugs/email during the Easter holidays. Please find additional instructions on how to access seesaw attached with this newsletter.

When you log in you will be able to see what home learning tasks have been set—we will set new activities each week. As well as seeing the tasks and any videos / resources the year group teachers may have put on, you can also upload your child's work on there so we can see what they have been up to. We will only know if you are accessing seesaw if you comment or post on the tasks—we really would love to see what you have been doing.

Please note that only teachers will be able to see the work you post—seesaw is not a public forum.

## Virtual Register

As a school we have a duty to check on the well being of all pupils on a regular basis. We have been trying to find the best way of doing this and recently we sent out a link to a short questionnaire. We would ask that each family spends just a couple of minutes completing the questions on the form.

If however, we do not receive a response, then staff will have to make phone calls to complete the check. This, as you can understand, can be quite a time consuming task.
